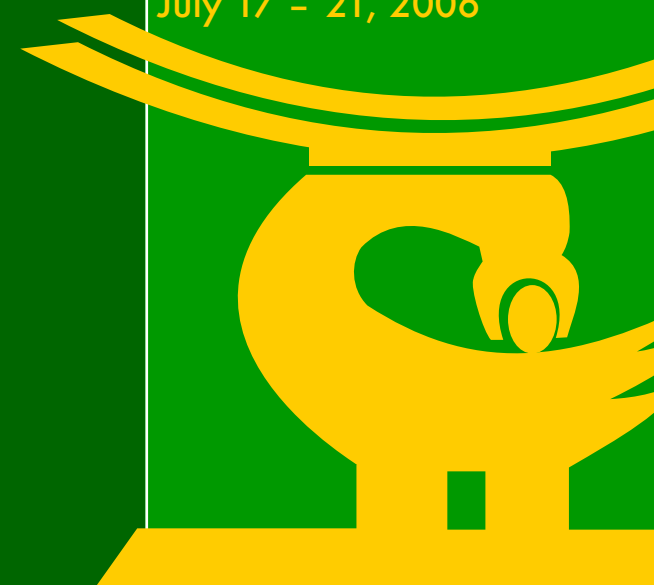

- Africentric values, principles and approaches as a philosophical and experiential framework;
- A practical approach which fills the gap between the theoretical study of Africentricity and practical strategies of Africentricity, for everyday social, cultural, political, economic and spiritual interactions;
- A case study approach that highlights typical leadership and management dilemmas faced by teachers, administration, Student Support Workers, Race Relations Staff, parents and others.

The course instructors guide participants through an intellectual, academic, cultural and spiritual journey to explore and uncover their hidden African-centred creativity, (Kuumba) – thereby enabling

them to solve real life problems faced by learners and educators. The desired outcome of the Institute is to provide participants with the vision and skills necessary to exercise culturally competent and culturally-responsible leadership and management practices.

Participants should have a minimum of two years experience in the education field; demonstrated leadership and management experience, or the desire to aspire to leadership and management roles is an asset.

The Summer Institute training site is located in the historically significant African Nova Scotian community of North Preston – which is home to the largest indigenous African population in Canada.
